ROAD TO MEGA-GUTAH APPROVED

Calgary, Alberta, September 21, 2006 – TUSK Energy Corporation ("TUSK") is pleased to report that it has received approval for the construction of a road to the Mega and Gutah light oil discovery areas. The road will facilitate a more rapid development of the potential demonstrated by both discoveries. The approved plan, with a total potential road length of approximately 19 miles, has the road starting in the south at the site of the TUSK Chinchaga oil battery and going through the Gutah light oil discovery area to the Mega area. The road will be constructed as an all-weather road to the Gutah area with "enhanced winter access" beyond that point to the Mega area. Clearing of the right-of-way for the road will commence prior to mid-October.

The Mega pool (52° API) is a Keg River oil pool discovered by the drilling of the TUSK 12-05-101-6 W6M well in January, 2004. The well was drilled to a total depth of 2,435 metres. Current production is restricted by a maximum rate limitation ("MRL") mandated by the Alberta Energy Utilities Board ("AEUB") to 377 bopd plus associated gas.

The Gutah light oil pool, located approximately 4 miles south of the Mega pool, was discovered by the drilling of the 6-17-101-5 W6M well in February of 2006. The 6-17 well, which encountered 46° API oil in the Keg River zone, went on-stream in early August, 2006 at an allowable restricted rate of 377 bopd plus associated gas.

The TUSK Chinchaga oil battery, built adjacent to a Keyera facility and connected to regional infrastructure, is accessible by all-weather road and located at the southern terminus of a pipeline, constructed and operated by TUSK, which transports oil, gas and condensate from the Mega and Gutah area wells. The plant has been constructed in a modular fashion and the plant capacity can be expanded in a timely and cost-effective manner.

Construction of the road will enable more rapid development of the Gutah and Mega pool areas and allow for drilling outside of the normal winter access season. TUSK plans an aggressive oil development program for both areas during the coming winter.
